3 CUPS COOKED EGG NOODLES


CHOPPED FRESH PARSLEY

We also serve waffles for breakfast at that time.





### A Note From Your Treasurer 29 February 2024

First Presbyterian finished the month of February with a bank balance of \$74,737 as a result, we will not need to draw from our investments to cover expenses during the month of March. Income for February, \$11,639, exceeded our expenses, \$10,904, meaning the church had a slight revenue surplus for the month of February. However, as the table below illustrates, the church continues to operate at a deficit.

Having entered the partnership with the First United Methodist Church of Ponca City for worship and mission, we have agreed to support the operating budget of FUMC. Our support is a proportional share of FUMC's budget based on each congregation's active membership and is to be paid quarterly. Your tithes and offerings are still needed at First Presbyterian and can be submitted at worship each Sunday by placing your offering in the blue envelopes available in the pew racks at FUMC. The blue envelopes are forwarded to FPC's office each Monday morning for recording.

If you are unable to attend Sunday worship services in person, you may still mail offerings to the church office if you wish. Otherwise, you may donate to First Presbyterian's budget and missions by clicking on the green "Give Now" button on the church's webpage (<a href="www.fpcponca.org">www.fpcponca.org</a>) or you may donate using your smartphone or tablet by pointing your device's camera at the QR Code appearing here.



As reported last month, FPC's property has been listed for sale but, pending any sale, we continue to be obligated to maintain the property and incur expenses for insurance, utilities, and maintenance. Until the property is sold, the building will continue to be occupied by the office staff, the Coryell Cupboard, TOPS, and the Scout troop, and be in use by others in the community as appropriate or necessary.

First Presbyterian's continues to be committed to supporting mission work and your continued faithful support through your offerings is encouraged and is greatly appreciated.
